Re: Addiction Treatment Services for Native Americans with Medicaid Fee for Service

Dear OASAS Providers,

A patient who is an enrolled member of any federally recognized tribal nation qualifies for services under a Medicaid Fee-For-Service plan. Native Americans *may* join the Medicaid Managed Care Program, but are not required to do so¹.

Providers operating certified programs funded by OASAS are obligated to accept and provide treatment for any individual who seeks care, regardless of ability to pay.² All certified, funded or otherwise authorized OASAS providers are obligated to provide treatment to Native Americans who are enrolled in Fee-For-Service Medicaid. Providers cannot require or request that enrolled members of federally recognized tribal nations enroll in a Medicaid Managed Care program as a condition to access addiction treatment services.
