 ** All CASACs who are credentialed prior to July 1, 2018 will be grandparented into the CASAC Level 2 regardless of education level. All individuals credentialed July 2, 2018 or after will need to have a minimum of an Associate's Degree in a Human Services area to receive a CASAC level 2.



*** Current Clinical Supervisors who have at least a Bachelor’s degree (but no QHP status); or CASAC or RN (but no Bachelor’s Degree); may be grandparented into the Advanced Counselor level if they meet the current clinical supervisor definition (below) at renewal period after 1/1/2018 or at the time of hire between the period 1/1/2018 and 12/31/2020. They must also complete the 30 Hours of Clinical Supervision Foundations I & II. NOTE: Private Practice is prohibited unless licensed by the NYS Education Department in a qualifying profession.

Training Requirements: Requirements must be satisfied for current staff by 7/1/2018. Newly hired staff must satisfy the requirements within one year of their hire date.

- 1. Supporting Recovery with Medications for Addiction Treatment (MAT): https://healthknowledge.org/course/search.php?search=Medication+Assisted : Successful completion required by all staff.
2. Introductory Training in the Addictions (content TBD by Provider) Content must be a minimum of 12 hours and must contain at least 6 Hours of training on the CASAC Canon of Ethics and 3 Hours of Confidentiality related to 42CFR: Successful completion required for all Counselor Assistants, Provisional QHPs, and any other QHP who does not meet the training and experience requirements for a QHP as defined by OASAS regulations.
3. Clinical Supervision Foundations I & II (30 hours): Successful completion required by all Advanced and Master Level CASACs and QHPs.

Definitions:

Internships/Field Placements- Students enrolled in an OASAS approved 350-Hour CASAC Education Program and/or enrolled in a Human Services/Social Work/Counseling degree program.
Current Clinical Supervisor- (Applies only to those who meet the definition of current clinical supervisor and either have a CASAC without at least a Bachelor’s Degree OR Bachelor’s degree without a CASAC or other QHP status) – Must have a CASAC or Other QHP status OR at least a Bachelor’s Degree with no CASAC or other QHP Status and at least two years of full-time (4000 hours) clinical supervision experience in the last five years, providing regular face-to-face supervision for one or more QHPs who are primary counselors and carry a regular caseload of clients. If you do not meet this definition you may not be a Clinical Supervisor until you meet all minimum requirements for at least the Advanced Counselor level.
Qualified Health Professional – as defined by OASAS Regulation Part 800.3 at: https://oasas.ny.gov/chemical-dependence-services-general-provisions-part-800
Master Counselor Experience – CASAC or QHP for at least three consecutive years immediately prior to qualify for this level and Master’s Degree in Human Services.

Timeline for Implementation:

Credentialed Individuals and New Applicants:

OASAS will provide Certificates for those who have CASACs ONLY. CASAC Advanced and Master levels will be available as of 1/1/2018

January 2017– July 1, 2018 - Automatic Grandparenting of all current CASACs to CASAC Level 2s regardless of Education Level. Current CASACs will be able to document their status through the online verification portal at: https://webapps.oasas.ny.gov/credentialingverification/verification/home.cfm individuals will receive their new certificate at their regular renewal interval.

1/1/2018 – 12/31/2020 – CASAC renewal applicants, who do not have at least a Bachelor’s degree but are current supervisors, will have the opportunity to apply to OASAS for grandparenting for the CASAC Advanced Level. QHPs with no Bachelor’s Degree may also be eligible for the Counselor Advanced level if they are current supervisors. See “current supervisor” definition above.

1/1/2018 – Scopes of Practice formally goes into effect. Starting with the CASAC Renewals, if eligible, CASACs will receive a CASAC Advanced Counselor or Master Counselor.

7/2/2018 – All initial applicants credentialed on or after 7/2/2018 will need to have at least an Associate’s Degree to obtain a CASAC Level 2 or higher.

OASAS Certified Treatment Programs: 7/1/2018 – OASAS Certified programs will need to document compliance with SUD Counselor Scopes of Practice and placement of all staff within each category. All staff who perform clinical services other than CASACs will be assigned their level of functioning by their employer. Questions – Julia.Fesko@oasas.ny.gov
