Consistent with NYS Executive Law Articles 15-A and 17-B, the New York State Office of Addiction Services and Supports (OASAS) is committed to providing Minority-Owned and Women-Owned Business Enterprises (MWBEs) and Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Businesses (SDVOBs) with opportunities to sell their products and services to New York, in accordance with State law and regulations.

The State's procurement process is instrumental in supporting the OASAS mission and vital agency operations and activities.

Each year, OASAS contracts with private-sector firms for products and services using preferred sources, Office of General Services centralized contracts, as well as discretionary contracts, to obtain necessary commodities, technology and services.

BECOME MWBE CERTIFIED:

Diversity is a key to business success in New York State – home to the highest minority and women-owned business (MWBE) utilization rate in the country. The Division of Minority and Women's Business Development (DMWBD) has created a one-stop hub for everything you need to know about MWBE success in New York. MWBE certification is administered by Empire State Development's DMWBD. The mission of DMWBD is to promote equality of economic opportunities for MWBEs and to eliminate barriers to their participation in State contracts.

BECOME SDVOB CERTIFIED:

The Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Business Act, signed into law on May 12, 2014, allows eligible Veteran business owners to get certified as a New York State Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Business (SDVOB). The goal of the Act is to encourage and support eligible SDVOBs to play a greater role in the state's economy by increasing their participation in New York State's contracting opportunities. The OGS Division of Service-Disabled Veterans' Business Development is responsible for certifying eligible SDVOBs and assisting and promoting their participation in the state's procurement activities.
