



**Notice of Proposed Rulemaking
Summary**

Amend Part 807

Responsibilities Regarding Transmissible Infections Associated with Injection Drug Use: HIV, Hepatitis A, B, and C, Chlamydia, Gonorrhea, Syphilis, and Tuberculosis

In addition to technical amendments updating this regulation consistent with Title 14, the Proposed Rule amends Part 807 as follows:

§807.1 Applicability: no changes made.

§807.2 Legal Basis: technical changes to update language.

§807.3 Intent: technical changes to update language and add additional information related to the expansion of infectious diseases that this regulation now addressed.

§807.4 Definitions: adds numerous definitions including those related to Hepatitis A, B, and C, Chlamydia, Gonorrhea, Syphilis, and Tuberculosis, and updates outdated definitions.

§807.5 Policies and Procedures: technical changes to update language and addition of language related to communicable disease reporting.

§807.6 Infection Control Plan: technical changes updating language.

§807.7 HIV [-related] Testing and Prevention: addition of language related to patient consent of HIV tests.

§807.8 Hepatitis A Testing and Prevention: NEW section including language related to Hepatitis testing and prevention.

§807.9 Hepatitis B Testing and Prevention: NEW section including language related to Hepatitis B testing and prevention.

§807.10 Hepatitis C Testing and Prevention: NEW section including language related to Hepatitis C testing and prevention.

§807.11 Chlamydia Testing and Prevention: NEW section including language related to chlamydia testing and prevention.

§807.12 Gonorrhea Testing and Prevention: NEW section including language related to gonorrhea testing and prevention.

§807.13 Syphilis Testing and Prevention: NEW section including language related to syphilis testing and prevention.

§807.14 Tuberculosis Testing and Prevention: NEW section related to tuberculosis testing and prevention.

§807.15[8] Non-discrimination: technical changes updating language.

§807.16[9] Confidentiality and Disclosure of HIV-Related Information: no changes made.

§807.17 Communicable Disease Reporting Requirements: NEW section including language referencing the requirements to report in 10 NYCRR Part 2.

§807.18[0] [HIV-Related] Staff Training and Education about HIV, Hepatitis A, Hepatitis B, Hepatitis C, Chlamydia, Gonorrhea, Syphilis, and Tuberculosis: technical changes updating language.

§807.1 Severability: no changes made.

Definitions. A new section addressing definitions applicable to this Part is added.

§819.3 Standards applicable to all residential service providers. Adds and updates requirements applicable to residential service providers consistent with other OASAS residential programs including the development of policies and procedures, access to medications for addiction treatment for substance use disorders and service provision.

§819.4 Admission procedures. Updates consistent with appropriate use of terminology. Provisions relating to non-discrimination are removed and reference is added to compliance with Part 815.

§819.5 Post admission procedures. Updates consistent with appropriate use of terminology related to medical and clinical assessments post-admission. Treatment planning and discharge provisions are updated consistent with OASAS updates to all certified programs.

§819.6 Record keeping. Updates consistent with appropriate use of terminology and record keeping requirements around medications for addiction treatment.

§819.8 General staffing. Updates consistent with appropriate use of terminology consistent with OASAS regulations. Reference is added to appropriate duties that may fall to residents consistent with OASAS guidance. Staff training requirements are amended to occur every year instead of every three years and the list of appropriate trainings are updated consistent with other certified program requirements.
